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My Brother Lightship Sailors, Members and Friends:

As we wind down another year I would like to take this my final opportunity to report on the well being and solid structure of our organization. Our organization is strong both physically and financially. As has been reported in the past, your organization operates under a set of printed By-laws in concert with *Roberts Rules of Order* governing parliamentary procedure via your elected board of directors.

Yes, we have had smoother years. And yes again, this year has presented some challenges, as we should expect could occur being in our 13 th year without any major dips. We have not had a resignation from your board of directors since the year 2000, and this year we will have three, all three have been totally and completely beyond any ones control and is in no way a reflection on the organization or those that resigned. As you know, your board of directors requested that I serve out the 10 months of this year as your interim president (this action to ratified in Hyannis), and I agreed to the 10 months, and we have operated without a 1st VP since February (this is not a good situation).

We do need to fill three positions on the board to finish out this term (2010-2012), please consider stepping up in Hyannis.

We continue to search for a suitable site in order to re-establish our museum. This is no less critical now than before 2008. Our main purpose then, and now, is to preserve our history as Lightship Sailors. Other than the Lightships open to the public and the memorial in New Bedford (originally in memory of those lost on the Vineyard) there is no other memorial in recognition of our service.

It is difficult to find a facility that meets our requirements. One of our limitations is we simply can't provide man power on a daily basis, so it almost for certain would need to be a part of another staffed and secure facility. The organization is in a position where we can pay a stipend, as we have since opening our original museum in 2008, to our host museum.

As reported in the past, all of our artifacts are in a secure climate controlled storage facility. And we continue to receive items that eventually will be on display with appropriate credits. We still are hopeful we will have some positive news to report and ideally vote on a new home in Hyannis. Should anyone have information on a possible location, please (double please) let us know and we will contact the possible venue.

I thank you for allowing me the honor of serving this fine organization for the past 6 years and 10 months as president and for a total of 7 years 10 months on your board of directors. Help Keep the Light Shining,

After I was elected to the LSA board, I was appointed to Veterans Affairs. During the past year I have tried to help those of you who have contacted me in trying to obtain VA benefits and I hope I was successful.

I received my benefits with the assistance of Bernie Byrnes, past Chairman, who I could never replace. His knowledge and background paperwork on fog horns assisted me in getting me 10% disability and hearing aids.

I have this paperwork and if hearing loss due to noise of the fog horns or engine room applies to you, please contact me and I will forward this to you.

Also, one of our shipmates, Charles Gillingham, has very generously offered his entire file for distribution and display from a 4 year fight with The VA. This file contains the various cover letters along with supporting documents earning Charles a 10% disability for tinnitus and a 10% disability for hearing loss, all tax free. This file will be available for inspection in Hyannis and may serve as a template for future applications.

Most of us who receive benefits for hearing problems know how difficult it is to get the benefits that are due to us. My advice to you is to be patient, persistent and keep trying. Use all available resources, i.e. American Legion or your congressman.

A Short Sea Story

This meeting of *Jim Sheahan* of Yarmouth, and *Richard Arnold* of Gloucester Massachusetts started last Fall in 2010. *Jim Sheahan* had contacted me due to me being involved with the Lightship Sailors Association. Jim had been trying to contact some friends of his that were members of the LSA. During the conversation, the subject of Hurricane Edna came up, and Jim mentioned he had been one of the crew aboard during that horrific Storm! He also talked about his friend, and former crewmember *Richard Arnold*. I assumed the two had been in touch over the years, the way Jim spoke of Richard. I mentioned the 112 was back in Boston, and invited Jim to come to Boston to come aboard, and bring Richard along. Arrangements had to be made for a meeting of sorts to hear and document his experience during the hurricane.....Over the Winter months, Jim contacted me a few times, each telephone conversation, making me more eager to meet this gentleman in person! I had mentioned these conversations to Bob Mannino, and he was just as eager to meet Jim as I was. We both knew of the impact thru Newspaper clippings on line, but were extremely anxious to hear it from actual crewmembers who lived through the genuine experience.

Jim and Richard anxious to meet each other again! I did not know it, but neither had seen each other since 1954! Richard had not seen nor stepped foot on deck since then either. Jim had visited the 112 20 yrs or so earlier, while she had been owned by the Nantucket Group on Nantucket. Anyone would have thought that each of them had seen each other a week ago! But as I stated, not since 1954, 57 years ago!

We entered the Wheelhouse, where Richard started telling us about his experience during Hurricane Edna. He had been on watch, standing between the shipswheel, looking out the forward portholes. As the Nantucket was bobbing up and down, Richard stated he saw a mountain of “green water” approaching in the distance which appeared to be 60 or 70 foot high traveling at an extremely fast pace. He also stated, the size of the wave varied depending on how many times the story was told! As the wave approached, he turned to holler to *Chief Corea* who was in the Captains Quarters just a few feet away, “Hey Chief! You better come up here quick!” As the Chief stepped out of his cabin, the wave had struck the Lightship, smashing through the ¾ inch portholes! Chief Corea was stepping in water, sparks flying as the Atlantic washed into the Wheelhouse, soaking the rear walls. Shorting fuse panels, switches, radio equipment etc. The Chief was stunned as Richard was also. But the Chief and crew knew what to do! As this was happening, the Nantucket had broke anchor, being thrown every way you could imagine. In the Radio Room, Jim Sheahan heard the commotion, and reported to Bob Mannino and I, he thought the ship had been struck by another vessel. First thing he did, was step into the passageway, and listened to identify if the ship was taking on water! He stated he didn’t hear any water pouring in anywhere, so back in the Radio Room, where he started to attempt to send an SOS while sparks were flying from the Radio!

Back in the bow area, Chief Corea had worked his way into the anchor room, where he was giving slack to the spare anchor chain. In 1954, the spare anchor was swung so the mushroom was stored at deck level thru the gunnel. The crew was concerned if the anchor broke free, it would swing down through the bow and puncture a hole in the hull.

Now it is noted by Richard and Jim, the wave also went over the funnel, drowning out the boilers. There was no power to run the ship at this moment. At the same time, Radioman Jim Sheehan was radioing for help frantically. They could not drop anchor without knowing their exact position. The water could be too deep, or they could be almost on the Shoals they were marking prior to breaking the anchor chain! All this while Hurricane Edna is blowing them about, sea’s splashing over the decks during the dark skies! While Jim was trying to raise someone on the radio, he suddenly was notified by a Navy Hurricane Hunter (airplane) their Latitude and Longitude. The crew plotted their position with this information. They knew now there position, and water depth. With 100 MPH winds, 50ft + Seas, Chief Corea and crewmembers dragged along one of the lines they secured previously in anticipation of the Hurricane, and were able to release the spare anchor. They felt a little more security now, even with the high seas and winds.

Getting back Steam to the boilers, prior to being notified of their position, the crew had tried to maneuver the Nantucket. The Helm would not respond. It was later learned the rudder had also been bent during the Hurricane.

The LV112 remained anchored until a CG Cutter arrived to tow them into Boston for repairs.

I want to mention, once again, Richard and Jim had parted ways after being towed to Boston. Each got assigned elsewhere. Neither had been in contact with each other since that day! It was a grand reunion and it could not have been a better place to meet again after all those years...but aboard the LV112 Nantucket right back in Boston, not a mile from where they last parted from the Nantucket and each other **57 years ago!**

Bob Mannino, and myself were extremely excited to meet Richard Arnold and James Sheahan. It is one thing to read newspaper accounts of experiences like this, but it is a whole different ballgame to hear it from the people who lived it and actually experienced going through a Hurricane such as Edna.

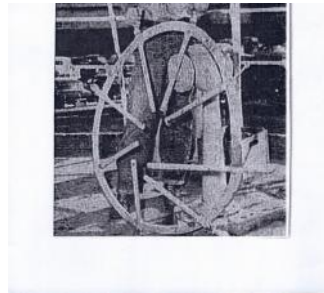
