Secretaries Report



It is my pleasure to report the various legislative matters that have come before The Board of Directors for action since our last General Membership Meeting in Portsmouth, VA. The following decisions were a result of motions being brought before the Board of Directors for a discussion and a vote:

November 19, 2005: A general discussion was held at the request of Larry Ryan, to debate the advantages of printing The Fog Signal in house, rather than through a commercial printing establishment. Realizing we were trading off some professional quality for cost savings and control on the actual mailing list, this was approved by unanimous consent.

December 11, 2005: Request by Larry Ryan for approval of the meeting agenda for 2007 reunion. Approved by unanimous consent.

December 14, 2005: A request by Larry Ryan for approval to finalize a contract with The Best Western Executive Inn, Seattle, WA as our headquarters for our 2007 meeting and reunion. Approved by unanimous consent. (Contract was signed by Fred Pelger, Treas., Jay McCarthy 1st VP, and Larry Ryan, Pres., returned February 7, 2006)

February 9, 2006: To amend the wording on certain By-laws for ratification by members:

Item 1: 6 yes, 2 No, 1 no vote, motion carried

Item 2: To include names of Founding Members, and Past Presidents under Article 1, Section5 (a) 8 yes, 1 NO. 1 No vote. Motion carried.

March 2006: A motion was made by Larry Ryan to approve the budget for the annual meeting in Seattle, with a registration fee of \$100 per person, a second motion was made to increase the fee to \$125.00, motion was defeated, original motion was passed with 8- yes, 1 No, I not voting (Chris Bennett)

May 25, 2006: Motion by John Hughes to establish a policy in dispersing the Lightship Preservation Funds.

Stipulation added by Fred Pelger that this be specifically approved by the members.

Second by Jay McCarthy,

Motion carried with 9-Yes, 0-No, 1 not voting (Chris Bennett.)

This is a true sea story about a "Real" Light Ship L.V. #92, a coal burner.

I enlisted in the Coast Guard in 1948 at the age of fourteen and served for 29 plus years.

In 1950-1951 I was assigned to the "Real" Lightship L.V. #92. Roland Miller Sr. was the commanding office and I was assigned as a seaman.

Light ship #92 was built as a coal burner about 1908. It had two large boilers for making steam, 90 ton coal bunkers and coal ports on both sides and a million cockroaches. The stoking was done by hand, approximately 1 ton a day on station and approximately 1 ton an hour underway at 6-8 knots.

The washing machine was a 10 gallon milk can, salt water, salt water soap and a toilet plunger as the agitator.

The Lightship # 92 was built as a coal burner and remained so until 1951 when she was decommissioned. She was never converted to diesel..

The Lightship #92 was relieved by Lightship # 604, the Columbia River. The #604 has been decommissioned and moared in Astoria, Oregon.

In 1966 as a boot W-0 W-1 I was assigned to Light Ship # 605 Blunts Reef as officer in charge. I made W-2 fourteen months later I was relieved by Roland Miller Jr., son of my C.O. on L.V. #92 sixteen years later.

I believe the Lightship #92 was the last coal burner in the Coast Guard.

There can't be a lot of "Real lightship sailors still around

Lightship #83/Wal 508

Built in Camden, NJ in 1904 for Blunts Reef Station, CA for The USLHSE At 668 Tons Displacement. She had 4 sisters, LV 78, 79, 80 and 81. They were all riveted steel hulls at 129' OAL, with a beam of 28'6".

All were coal fired, by hand, to twin boilers powering a single double expansion reciprocating steam engine generating 325 HP and 9 knots.

The two 90 ton coal bunkers were on either side of the boilers, consuming around 1 ton of coal per hour while under way, and 1000 to 1500 pounds a day on station.

While under way, the throttle man also served as oiler until The USLHS as absorbed into the USCG in 1939.

The #83 sailed as part of a convoy, including a second Lightship the #76/504, in 1905, Convoy Commander was Capt. E. M. Trott.

She arrived on Blunts Reef Station, CA in 1906 where she would serve for the next 23 years. She was assigned to San Francisco Bar from 1929 until 1942, she became an examination vessel until after the war where she was reassigned As San Francisco until 1951 when she became The Relief until retirement in 1960.

The #83 is one of the two oldest surviving Lightships, and the only one still afloat with the original steam plant. Except for being oil fired, replacing coal in early 1940. The coal bunkers were enclosed as fuel oil tanks and equipped with steam driven double acting reciprocating fuel pumps, replacing scoop shovels. The fuel source was referred to originally as "All Fuel", the equivalent of #2 diesel or heating oil today.

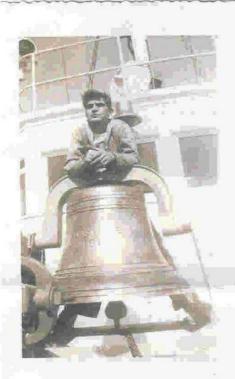
Which made life much easier on the engine room crew and the deck crew due to cleaner conditions. The #83 is now owned by The NW Seaport, Seattle, WA where she is sharing space with a fleet of historic vessels.

The known Commanding Officers under the USCG were Thomas Curtis, 1935-1941, Ross Anway, 1943, and CWO Lok, 1948-1949.

The #83 is now 101 years old, indeed The Queen of The Lightship Fleet, Well Done Good and Faithful Servant.

Joseph B. Ratcliffe, BT3, USCG Founding Member, LSA

Joe is pictured here on board the LV#83/WAL508, as San Francisco Lightship, September 1949, age 19 years old.

Joe went to boot camp in Mayport, FL, in February 1947, from boot camp direct to The Roger B. Taney for 18 months. He was then transferred to LV#83/WAL 508 serving on The San Francisco Lightship Station in October 1948 and served until October 1949. San Francisco Station is between the Golden Gate Bridge and The Farollon Islands marking the entrance to San Francisco Bay.

Joe came aboard the Lightship as an FN, made Third Class BT and then transferred to the Gresham for 7 months, then to base supply where he finished his 4 year enlistment.

"No other duty compared to The Lightship duty, CWO Lok was a great Skipper, great food, and the 7 days leave was also great"

We want to thank Joe for providing a wonderful set of original photographs for this publication, a great way to help preserve our history.

Joe will be returning to The #83 in Seattle after a 57 year absence, we hope you will come and help welcome him back.

I am pleased to report on our successful campaign to win compensation for most that have contacted me on your hearing loss. There are still many, many more of you out there, please contact me and let me help. There are a lot of little items that need to be processed in a very specific manner for you to win, don't try to do it alone. This is what I do for a living.
